
**Leanne Grano ('95)** took over her father's pizza franchise, Ned's Pizza on 27th Street, which originally opened in the 1950s.

# CONGRESS-BUNDESTAG YOUTH EXCHANGE SCHOLARS

Seniors **Anja du Plessis** and **Octavia Grimes** were awarded the 2019 Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange (CBYX) Scholarship. Initiated in 1983, the Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange program was created to strengthen ties between Germany and the United States. CBYX is jointly funded by the U.S. Congress and the German Bundestag, and is overseen in the U.S. by the State Department's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs. CBYX scholars serve as youth ambassadors for the United States, sharing our culture with Germans and bringing the German culture back to their home communities. Anja and Octavia are the 14th and 15th Nicolet German students to be selected for this program in the last 16 years!

#### NATIONAL HISTORY DAY

This spring, several students participated in the National History Day contest in Madison:

- Haley Shamah won fourth place in the Senior Individual Exhibit category for her project titled, Munich 1972: Tragedy Unfolding on the World Stage.
- Molly McVey's documentary, Passenger Pigeon: The Tragedy of Extinction and the Triumph of Conservation, placed fourth in its category.
- Ethan Schupper and Luis McDougal's website, The Manhattan Project: The Tragedies That Emerged from the Triumphs of Science, placed third in its category.
- Joyce Essuman won the Geography Award for her senior individual website, The Sharpeville Massacre: the Precipitator of the Carnage of South African Inequality.
- Miah Bohlen won the Civil Rights History Award for her senior individual documentary, Wangari Maathai: Planting Seeds of Change.

# STATE SPANISH PRONUNCIATION CONTEST

Twenty-three Nicolet students participated in the American Association of Teachers of Spanish Wisconsin (AATSP-WI) State Spanish Pronunciation Contest. Overall, Nicolet won 34 first place gold medals, nine second place ribbons and two third place ribbons in five separate events: memorized narration, memorized poetry, extemporaneous narration, extemporaneous conversation, and theater. 


#### HOSA-FUTURE HEALTH PROFESSIONALS REGIONALS




