As we approach the end of 2017 and reflect on the past year, the Nicolet community should be very proud. In addition to the updates and acknowledgments you will read in this newsletter, I would like to highlight a few of our most significant accomplishments.

Earlier this year, the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel named Nicolet Union High School District a 2017 Top Workplace. This award is well deserved and acknowledges the energy and attention our teachers and professional staff

commit to accelerating the achievement of every student, in every classroom, every day. I want to extend my congratulations and appreciation to our entire team!

I am also excited to let you know that Nicolet received a rating of Exceeds Expectations on the most recent School Report Card released by the state's Department of Public Instruction. We scored 78.7 (out of 100), and this news is even more encouraging because Nicolet's score continues to rise year after year despite the fact that the State Report Card has undergone modifications each year.

The State Report Card also validates other metrics that show Nicolet is headed in the right direction, including last year's junior class score of 23.7 on the statewide ACT assessment (compared to the statewide composite of 20.0). Over the last five years we implemented several curriculum enhancements to help all students reach their academic potential while also addressing the achievement gap. This year's score is a marked increase over previous years and a testament to the efforts of teachers and students.

CURRICULUM UPDATES

Nicolet conducted the second annual **College and Career Readiness Day** on October 18. Students in grades 9-11 took standardized assessments while seniors attended a series of breakout workshops to provide recommendations on writing college letters, completing college applications and applying for scholarships.

Nicolet is again offering juniors the opportunity to participate in an ACT® prep program. Our goal is to give Nicolet students a competitive advantage when taking the ACT® next spring. Students were able to pick from a variety of options to best suit their schedule and preparation style.

Along with our partner primary school districts, Nicolet is reviewing the **Career and Technical Education Curriculum** to ensure the skills being taught align with state standards.

Nicolet science teacher **Jennifer Bault** (above) had the once-in-a-lifetime experience of **studying polar ice cores with leading researchers in Antarctica** as part of PolarTREC 2017. PolarTREC (Teachers and Researchers Exploring and Collaborating) is a program in which K-12 teachers spend 3-6 weeks participating in hands-on field research experiences in the polar regions.

As only one of three researchers on her team, Mrs. Bault studied seasonal ice production in the Ross Sea from October 21 to November 25, 2017. Students had the ability to follow her experience through her blog and a facilitated Skype session. Mrs. Bault is excited to use her unique experiences and research to benefit her work in the classroom.

Nicolet business teacher **Mike Kania** was recognized as a **W!SE Financial Literacy Gold Star Teacher** for the 2016-17 school year!

In the spring of 2017, students scored an average of 53% on the Financial Literacy Certification Pre-Exam at the beginning of the semester. At the end of the semester, students took the actual certification exam and received a class average of 84%. Twenty-two out of the twenty-three students, or 95.7%, scored high enough to earn the W!SE Financial Literacy Certification. Thomas Croft, who graduated in 2017, scored a perfect 100% on his exam and was a finalist for a \$10,000 scholarship from W!SE.

ATHLETIC UPDATES



The fall sports season for the Nicolet Knights was highly successful. The **Boys Volleyball** team captured the North Shore Conference Championship with a 7-1 record and also won the WIAA Regional Championship, advancing to the Sectional Semi-Finals. Senior outside hitter **Sean Shtivelberg** was named NSC Player of the Year. The **Girls Tennis** team finished 2nd in the NSC and advanced to the WIAA State Tournament with a sectional championship win over rival Whitefish Bay. The **Boys Soccer** team finished 2nd in the new 10-team NSC with a 7-1-1 record, its highest conference finish in several years, and won the WIAA Regional Championship, advancing to the WIAA Sectional Semi-Finals. The **Girls Volleyball** team won the WIAA Regional Championship and advanced to the WIAA Sectional Semi-Finals. Senior **Cori Meyers** became just the third player in school history to record 1,000 kills and has committed to play volleyball in college for Winona State University next year. The **Girls Swim** team finished 4th in the very tough NSC and advanced five swimmers (Taylor Hall, Elizabeth Sullivan, Anna Christenson, Kate Tobin, Ana Eurich) to the WIAA State Tournament. The **Boys Cross Country** team advanced two runners (Max Selbach and Nick Holmes) to the WIAA State Tournament. The **Nicolet Football** team defeated Cedarburg in their last game of the season, 21-14. It was their first varsity win against the Bulldogs since 1991.



Ten Nicolet student-athletes were selected to participate in a series of leadership exercises on November 1st in Hartford as part of a Leadership Conference sponsored by The North Shore Conference. 100 students (10 from each school) participated. Nicolet Theater Director Laura Anderle chose 1984 as the fall play because of its topical nature, and was pleased to see how students connected with the material and eagerly shared their insights about the subject matter during rehearsal discussions. Anderle commented, "Having conversations like this is what sparks me to continue to teach theater." As one parent observed, the post-performance discussion was an example of how the performing arts can be a means to introduce students to critical thinking, much like an exercise in a humanities course.
