 1. ADMINISTRATION
 1. Dr. Kabara
 1. 2021 Operational Referendum
 1. Voting in April, absentee starting March 16
 2. Why?
 1. Supports daily operations and helps maintains current programs, services and class sizes
 3. History
 1. 2011 – 2016 Non recurring referendum to exceed Revenue Cap for 5 years
 2. 2016-2022 Non recurring referendum to exceed Revenue Cap for six years
 3. Why now? To avoid gaps
 4. Financial picture – Jeff Pruefer
 1. During the past recent referendum, things look steady. The projection shows our reserves start to fall until we are eventually under water
 2. Options
 1. Significant budget reductions
 2. Pursue a combination of cuts
 3. Maintain current programs and services via a \$3.9M referendum
 4. Maintain current programs and services and contribute \$200K to prefund capital needs via \$4.1M referendum
 3. Most logical support for the \$3.9M for 6 years referendum

4. With the referendum, the financial picture looks steady through 2027-28.
 5. Tax impact
 1. \$17 per \$100,000 of home value
 5. What if the referendum fails?
 1. Elimination of co-curricular and extra curricular
 2. Reduction of teacher and increase of class sizes
 3. Reducing class variety
 4. Reduction of funding for instruction technology

2. About Nicolet
 1. Showed mission, vision and values statements
 2. We are "Significantly Exceeds Expectations"
 3. Strong diverse population (teach 4 world languages, 14 home languages)
 4. ACT scores are 3 points higher than state average
 5. 26 AP courses offered – 85% pass rate (3 or higher) – also offer courses that with college credit
 6. 19 sports/30 teams
 7. 30+ co-curricular clubs
 8. Art program received state and national recognition
 9. Performing arts receive state recognition
2. Mr. Coyle
 1. Brief overview of second semester
 1. Successful start. Lots of work went into getting the teachers ready and getting the building ready.
 2. Staff is impressed with the students
 3. Lunch is going well. Rough start with ordering but it's been figured out pretty quick. The kids aren't super excited about the seating situation but they're managing. Staff recognizes that it's not the best but so do the kids and they're generally willing to do what they need to stay in school
 4. Everyone's working hard. Positive things are happening.
 5. Teachers and educators are in the next phase of getting vaccines – hopefully by the end of March all staff will have the opportunity to be vaccinated.

3. Mr. Coyle will step back into being AP next year
3. Athletics
 1. Girls basketball – 1st playoff win in 6 years!
 2. Boys basketball – up and down season. Kobe Johnson finished with a great season.
 3. Boys swimming – 6th overall. Jack Sullivan (freshman) is faster than Garrett Webber Gale was at this age!
 4. Gymnastics – on the way to state!
 5. A couple of girls from Nicolet played for MWC and went far in the state tourney
 6. Spring sports are starting up
 1. There's a push for a girls rugby club
4. Graduation
 1. Plan is to have it outdoors on the athletic field
 2. Dr. Kabara and Mr. Coyle will be discussing it tomorrow
 3. There will be a date and a couple of back ups due to weather
 4. Milwaukee Theatre is still reserved if Milwaukee will allow for it. But hoping for on campus so more people can attend.
 5. Heather and Amy in the office will be heading up graduation

 1. Mr. Coyle meets monthly with area principals
