Under Act 55, public schools are required to annually communicate to parents and guardians the following:

- the academic standards adopted by the school board for the school year
- the school's accountability report (report card)
- a list of the educational options available
- the existence of the special needs voucher program

Academic Standards

Accountability Report

As part of the new state accountability system, the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) has produced report cards for every district and school in Wisconsin. These report cards provide data on multiple indicators. More information and the most recent report card may be viewed at <u>Accountability Report</u> <u>Cards</u>. The Nicolet Union High School District received a rating of Exceeds Expectations or Significantly Exceeds Expectations for each year reports cards have been released by the Department of Public Instruction.

Educational Options

School districts are required to provide a list of the <u>Educational Options</u> available to children who reside in the student's resident school district, including public schools, private schools, private schools participating in a private school choice programs, charter schools, virtual schools, open enrollment, early college credit, start college now, home-based private education, and information on the Special Education Voucher Program.
